

## Resumé

2003 – Present: IKEA Purchasing Services AB. Chemicals leader for IKEA Purchasing global: coordination of implementation of IKEA chemical requirements in IKEA Purchasing. Peter Adler has been based in China and in Sweden, and works to support IKEA Purchasing offices, their Product Compliance Specialists and their Purchasing Teams in their work to secure chemical compliance at IKEA suppliers and in their supply chains. Peter leads the chemical compliance work in IKEA Purchasing across 30 IKEA Purchasing categories and vis-à-vis over 1 000 IKEA suppliers. Coordinating compliance projects, eveloping expertise in compliance reviews, facilitating trainings and compliance forums with IKEA co-workers and suppliers, supporting trouble-shooting. Peter is also deeply involved in the preparation of IKEA chemical specifications, and is owner of the IKEA documentation management specification.

1999 – 2003: ÅF Environmental Consulting. Consulting for industry, government authorities and international development aid. Focus on clean technology, legal compliance, waste management and chemicals.

1988-1999: Swedish EPA, Principal Technical Officer. SEPA evaluations and presentations for the licensing of large and medium-sized industrial plants. Support to and setting guidelines for local and regional environmental protection authorities about technologies for pollution prevention and control. Working together with industry representatives in programs on waste minimisation and clean production in the engineering industry and the foundry industry. Participating in the preparation of directives and regulations of the European Union, such as the IPPC Directive and the Directive on VOC emissions from solvent use in industry, as well as the Regulation on substances that deplete the ozone layer. This included participating in negotiations in the Council of Ministers' Environmental Working Group, and preparing Swedish proposals and amendments. Work in the Montreal Protocol for Protection of the Ozone Layer.
