1. Etienne Gonin



Programme Analyst - Montreal Protocol, Chemicals and Waste Unit - Nature, Climate and Energy team.

Etienne works for the Montreal Protocol, Chemicals and Waste Unit of BPPS/GPN. Based in the Istanbul Regional Hub of UNDP, he is part of the team covering Europe and the CIS (ECIS), Africa and Arab States. He supports implementation of Montreal Protocol projects funded by the Multilateral Fund and other donors, and on Climate-Ozone interlinkages. He is also a Regional Technical Advisor for Chemicals and Waste projects in the same regions (mostly in Africa, with funding from the Global Environment Facility), working on disposal of obsolete and toxic

chemicals (such as PCBs used in the electricity sector), on the reduction of emissions of dioxins and furans and on phase-out of mercury (for example working on management of health care waste and artisanal small-scale gold mining) and on green/circular economy.
