# Effects of COVID on Tourism

#### The Caribbean in 2019

- 31 Million Stay-over Visitors
- Cruise Visitors totaled 30.2 million
- Collectively visitors spent an estimated 40.6 Billion

#### The Caribbean in 2020

Caribbean destinations experienced a 67% fall in international tourist arrivals in 2020 compared to the previous year.

Full recovery not expected prior to 2024.

# Caribbean Sustainable Financial Architecture





The Caribbean Biodiversity Fund (CBF) and its partner National Conservation Trust Funds (NCTFs), (currently at 10), form the Caribbean Sustainable Finance Architecture (CSFA), a network of independent Caribbean conservation trust funds dedicated to mobilizing financial resources at the regional, sub-regional and national levels for conservation efforts in the Caribbean.

Bahamas Protected Area Fund (BPAF), National Conservation Trust Fund of Jamaica (NCTFJ), Haiti Biodiversity Foundation (FHB for its acronym in French), Fondo MARENA, Marine Ecosystems and Protected Areas Trust (MEPA), Saint Christopher and Nevis Conservation Foundation (SCNCF), Saint Lucia National Conservation Fund (SLUNCF), Saint Vincent and the Grenadines National Conservation Fund (SVGCF), Grenada Sustainable Development Trust (GSDTF), Guyana Protected Areas Trust (GPAT).

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## **Possible Opportunities & Solutions** – Moving From Aspiration to Implementation

#### Don't reinvent the wheel - let's push it forward together

- Avoid duplication of effort Streamline Initiatives
- "Umbrella" Tourism Sustainability info platform
- CHTA/CAST/CHTAEF/CTO For example: a) make available grants to develop sustainability programs at National Hotel Association levels; b) support CAST to fulfill their role as the region's foremost sustainable tourism advocacy body; c) Establish/support regional events such as Green Travel and Tourism Conference/Green Travel Awards; d) Create sustainable tourism training and certification tools
- Consistent national public sector entity to drive the Sustainable Tourism Agenda forward

- Creation Sustainable PPS Tourism Dev
   Committees (National Conservation Funds, Ministries of Tourism, Tourism Boards, Hotel Associations)
- Caribbean "matchmaking" platform
   Matching projects in need of funding with funding agencies
- More accessible and innovative funding mechanisms for private and public sector needed.
   Private sector access to not just loans but also grants (for example; Compete Caribbean). For example: Blue Bonds – Green Resilience Bonds - Debt Conversion
- Make use of existing national conservation and/or tourism enhancement funds
- Resilience fee payable by stay-over and cruise visitors
- Make use of new and innovative digital payment platforms (for example; DWallet (OECS) / Penny Pinch)
