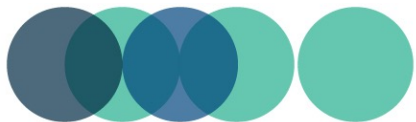
Reflections on success strategies

- Integration from conceptual stage to drive integrative design and implementation process
- Staff and partner recruitment + buy in
- Build on the existing evidence-base
- Continuous and multi-directional learning and reflection, and making adjustments as needed



Reflections on challenges

- GBV risk monitoring and mitigation
- Internal advocacy, capacity development, and transformation may be needed because there is mixed understanding of GBV and how GBV intersects with other development challenges
- Innovative integration work is about disrupting business-as-usual practices which require space for mistakes
- Collaboration and transformation require skills in having uncomfortable conversations, conflict resolution, and flexibility in programming and management

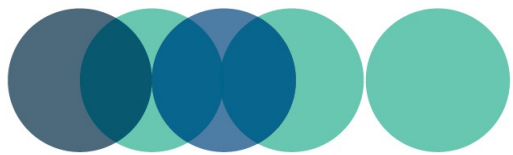


Reflections on the future of integration
