

## Thailand Stockholm+50 National Consultation

### Concept Note, Activities, and Timeline

#### I. Background

The 1972 United Nations Conference on Human Environment (the Stockholm Conference) held in Stockholm, Sweden, from June 5 to 16, 1972 was the first world conference to make the environment a major issue. A series of principles for sound management of the environment, including the Stockholm Declaration and the Action Plan for the Human Environment and its development, were adopted by the participating delegations from 114 governments. The Stockholm Declaration, which contained 26 principles, placed environmental issues at the forefront of international concerns and marked the start of a dialogue between industrialized and developing countries on the link between economic growth, the pollution and environmental damage, and the well-being of people around the world. The Action Plan contained 109 specific recommendations related to human settlements, natural resource management, pollution, educational and social aspects of the environment, and international institutions. The broad types of action that make up the Action Plan are: the global environmental assessment programme (Earthwatch); environmental management activities; and international measures to support national and international actions of assessment and management. The Stockholm Conference also led to the creation of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) in December 1972 to coordinate global efforts to promote sustainability and safeguard the natural environment.

#### II. Introduction

Context and Theme. The period since Stockholm 1972 has seen some major achievements in environmental protection, including the considerable development of international environmental law and the production of high-quality global assessment reports. Environmental degradation nevertheless continued and often intensified with population growth (doubling of the world's population in 50 years) and increased resource needs. Furthermore, the climate issue has become a priority that disrupts the natural systems and exacerbates the need for more active policies in the areas of natural resources and environmental management.

To commemorate the 1972 Stockholm Conference and celebrate 50 years of global environmental action, by recognizing the importance of multilateralism in tackling the Earth's triple planetary crisis (i.e., climate change, nature and biodiversity loss, and pollution and waste), an international environmental meeting will be held in Stockholm, Sweden on 2 and 3 June 2022. Under the theme "*Stockholm+50: a healthy planet for the prosperity of all – our responsibility, our opportunity*," the Stockholm+50 aims to accelerate the implementation of the UN Decade of Action to deliver the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), including the 2030 Agenda, Paris Agreement on climate change, the post-2020 global Biodiversity Framework, and encourage the adoption of green post-COVID-19 recovery plans.

The Modality. The Stockholm+50 is convened by the United Nations and is hosted by Sweden with support from the Government of Kenya. The modalities resolution specifies that the Stockholm+50 will be held as an “international meeting,” and not a conference. The UN General Assembly determined “that the international meeting will result in a summary of discussions as its outcome document.” Regarding outcomes of the meeting, “there is no expectation to redefine, renegotiate, nor mandate new mechanisms or new commitments, nor to go beyond the provisions of multilateral environmental agreements.”<sup>1</sup>

Leadership Dialogues. The two-day meeting will comprise: an opening segment, including a “commemorative moment dedicated to” the 1972 Conference; four plenary meetings held in parallel with three leadership dialogues; and a closing segment. The leadership dialogues are envisioned as collaborative and multi-stakeholder, with a focus on recommendations. The three dialogues will address:

LD1 – Reflecting on the urgent need for actions to achieve a healthy planet and prosperity of all;

LD2 – Achieving a sustainable and inclusive recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic; and

LD3 – Accelerating the implementation of the environmental dimension of Sustainable Development in the context of the Decade of Action.

Preparatory Meeting. The resolution tasks the UNGA President with convening *a one-day preparatory meeting* at UN Headquarters in New York by April 2022 (scheduled on 28 March 2022 at UN Headquarters in New York). The meeting will consider preparations for the leadership dialogues and other aspects of the meeting. Ahead of the preparatory meeting, the Secretary-General of Stockholm+50 – the Executive Director of UNEP – will prepare a concept note and draft background papers on each leadership dialogue. UNEP is to serve as the focal point for providing support to the organization of the international meeting, with appropriate support from the Secretariat and other relevant United Nations entities.

To ensure that strong messages and concrete recommendations will be presented in the Leadership Dialogues, Informal Working Groups are being established for each of the three themes to guide the work leading up to the international meeting. This process aims to reinforce the bottom-up co-creation processes for the leadership dialogues.

The objectives of the *Informal Working Groups for Leadership Dialogues* are to:

- Provide input to the draft background papers for each Dialogue;
- Mobilize engagement and share experiences and initiatives on the theme of the Dialogue; and
- Identify actions, recommendations and deliverables for governments and stakeholders that can be presented in the Dialogues at Stockholm+50.

Regional Consultations. In the lead-up to Stockholm+50, *a series of regional multi-stakeholder consultations* will be organized by the initiative Global Opportunities for Sustainable

Development Goals (GO4SDGs)<sup>2</sup> and co-designed in close cooperation with Major Groups and all relevant stakeholders to:

- give a voice to and facilitate engagement of as many stakeholders as possible;
- ensure a bottom-up approach in mapping of key actions needed to safeguard our planet in the 21st century in the context of each country's and region's needs, including policies and actions required in those economic sectors most critical for sustainable development;
- review and assess how the state of our environment can be enhanced to help countries and regions attain the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the 2030 Agenda, with a particular focus on innovative and enhanced means of implementation as well as building and enhancing human capacities.

The regional consultations will take place between April and May 2022. As designed, the regional consultations are open to all government and stakeholder representatives, will be virtual, and will use the KUDO multilingual web conferencing platform. Registration will be open 3-4 weeks before the event.

In Asia and the Pacific, the regional multi-stakeholder consultation for Stockholm+50 is scheduled on 4 April 2022. The GO4SDGs is preparing the event in close cooperation with relevant partners including UNESCAP.

National Consultations. All major stakeholder groups (i.e., local governments, cities, civil society, women, indigenous peoples and local communities, faith-based groups, academia, youth, industry, finance, and philanthropic foundations) are encouraged to contribute to the preparation of the Stockholm+50 international meeting through a range of national consultations to reflect their voices and perspectives.

UNDP facilitates national consultations using resources provided by the Government of Sweden and leveraging existing in-country programming and partnerships including through its support to Nationally Determined Contributions processes (e.g., UNDP's Climate Promise) and broader work on nature, climate, energy, and other integrated SDG themes. Guidelines and the on-line SparkBlue dialogue platform have been prepared to help inform preparations for the National Consultations. UNDP works closely with UNEP and all members of UN Country Teams (UNCT) who have extensive experience in convening different development stakeholders and providing relevant knowledge to identify development challenges, opportunities, and solutions with a bottom-up approach rationale. UNCTs, under the leadership and guidance of the UN Resident Coordinator (UNRC), will support the national consultations as institutional resources and country context allow. The participation and

inputs of all UNCT members are encouraged in line with the objectives of Stockholm+50 and UN Resolutions defining its scope and role of the UN system.

### III. Objective and Content of Thailand Stockholm+50 National Consultations

With financial support from the Government of Sweden and facilitation by UNDP, Thailand Stockholm+50 national consultations will be organized between February and May 2022. These consultation outcomes will inform the Stockholm+50 international meeting through national reports that captures key findings, recommendations, data, media coverage, and links to national policy frameworks such as NDCs, NAPs, NBSAPs, green recovery, and sector strategies. They are also closely linked to regional and other thematic consultations organized by UNEP and partners.

**Objective.** The overall objective of Thailand Stockholm+50 national consultations is to stimulate an inclusive whole-of-society and whole-of-government dialogue on the main themes of Stockholm+50 as they relate to the Thai context. Based on local COVID-19 conditions and restrictions, the consultations will provide in-person and virtual platforms for ideas, insights, and innovation that:

- Build a shared global vision on how to achieve a healthy planet and prosperity for all while accelerating progress on the Sustainable Development Goals and Multilateral Environment Agreements through an inclusive green recovery;
- Offer clear recommendations for national and local governments, civil society, and private sector on priority actions that can advance national and sectoral policies that address climate change and leverage nature-based solutions, including through the Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) process, National Biodiversity Strategies and Action Plans (NBSAPs), green economy/green recovery, and SDG frameworks including the SDG localization process;
- Amplify the voices of the poor, youth, women, ethnic minorities, local communities, and other marginalized groups; and
- Influence national and global debates that consider the views of all stakeholders.

**Content.** To stimulate a meaningful debate at different levels and with a range of stakeholders, the following guiding questions on topics relevant to the main Leadership Dialogues will be adapted to align with Thailand's sustainable development concept and priority national and sector themes, treaty obligations (including human rights, environmental and labor rights), and different target audiences.

#### **IV. Expected Outputs and Outcomes**

Main Outputs: National Consultation Plan, Factual Report, Communication Strategy, Organization of National Consultations, and National Consultation Report on process and key outcomes as inputs for preparing UNDP global report to be presented at the meeting in Stockholm+50 as well as inform Country Participation in Stockholm international meeting, 2-3 June 2022.

Expectations:

- Liaise with Swedish and Kenya embassies, UNDP, UNCT, UNEP – regular consultation on the structure, scope, tentative dates and design of the consultations;
- Inclusive whole-of-society, whole-of-government process targeting development partners and other relevant national and local stakeholders;
- Stakeholder mapping for gender-responsive and inclusive consultations;
- Data inventory survey to inform consultations, global and local meeting, follow-up;
- Visibility and communications (including mainstream and social media, the UNDP's online SparkBlue S+50 national consultation page).

National Consultation Results: a) National Consultation Report; b) contribution to the global synthesis report for international meeting in Stockholm 2-3 June; and, c) post-Stockholm follow-up to inform NDCs, NBSAPs, MEAs, and linked national, sectoral, green recovery and SDG policies, programming, and resource mobilization (e.g., UNEP's Financing for SDGs initiative).

#### **V. Methods and Organization**

National Consultations Key Tasks:

- Initial planning and coordination to: define number and type of in-person/online live consultations; identify hosts/speakers/ facilitators, participants; prepare agenda, data and communications strategy;
- Launch of national consultations including save-the-date, invitations, sharing of background information (both in Thai and English languages) including on NDCs and other nature, climate, pollution, energy policy frameworks, populating SparkBlue virtual consultation page;
- Main in-person/live/streamed consultations (in Bangkok and outside Bangkok – details on programs and formats to be discussed and decided);
- Post-consultation online discussions (virtual meetings and on SparkBlue);
- Documentation and reporting on results from the consultations;
- Ongoing communications; and
- Post-Stockholm+50 follow-up through end-2022: (1) Development of Thailand NDC implementation plan/roadmaps to better mainstream NDC into other development and sectoral policies/plans linked to Stockholm+50 priorities; (2) Provision of guidance on future action to accelerate SDG localization, focusing on environment-related SDGs.

Based on the agreed timeline, which is scheduled between 16 February and 31 December 2022, the National Coordinator will work closely with the UNDP Thailand team and relevant partners to conduct the Stockholm+50 National Consultations activities in Thailand through participating, planning, and organizing a series of workshops, meetings, and interviews. Details of the national consultations planning and implementation will be discussed and agreed between the National Coordinator and the UNDP Thailand team, in close cooperation with UNCT/UNRC, UNEP, Swedish Embassy, Government focal agency, and other partners where needed.

## **VI. Stakeholders and Partners**

Thailand Stockholm+50 national consultation stakeholders will include national and local governments, cities, civil society, women, ethnic minorities and local communities, academia, youth, industry, business sector, finance, and philanthropic foundations. The main groups to consider involving in obtaining input to Thailand Stockholm+50 national consultation process may include:

- Political decision makers, including government authorities concerning environment and sustainable development at national, regional and local levels (such as Office of the Prime Minister/NESDC, Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment, Ministry of Interior, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Social Development and Human Security, Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives, Ministry of Energy, Ministry of Industry, Ministry of Education), national committee members, and parliamentarians);
- Key UN agencies (i.e., UNDP, UNCT, UNEP), Swedish and Kenya embassies;
- UN accredited and non-accredited major stakeholder groups, whereby individuals are represented by organizations, including women, youth, older persons, persons with disabilities, ethnic minorities and local communities, as well as other representatives from NGOs, community-based organizations, universities and research institutions, private sector entities, interest groups (such as trade unions, employers' organizations, advocacy groups, coalitions);
- Research institutes, experts, and academia on particular issues;
- Semi-governmental actors such as the National Human Rights Commission of Thailand, King Prajadhipok's Institute (KPI);
- Private sector entities, including TBCSD, Global Compact Network Thailand, registered private companies, small businesses and local entrepreneurs.

To facilitate the national consultations, subject to opportunities and challenges on the ground and in coordination with governments where appropriate, partners active nationally and sub-nationally will be engaged, drawing on their expertise, outreach mechanisms and stakeholder networks. These include:

- Universities (national or regional academic institutions) and think tanks;
- National and sub-national government associations;
- International civil society organizations, networks and coalitions operating in Thailand; and,
- Other relevant UN agencies, embassies and missions, donors (bilateral, multilateral, foundations).

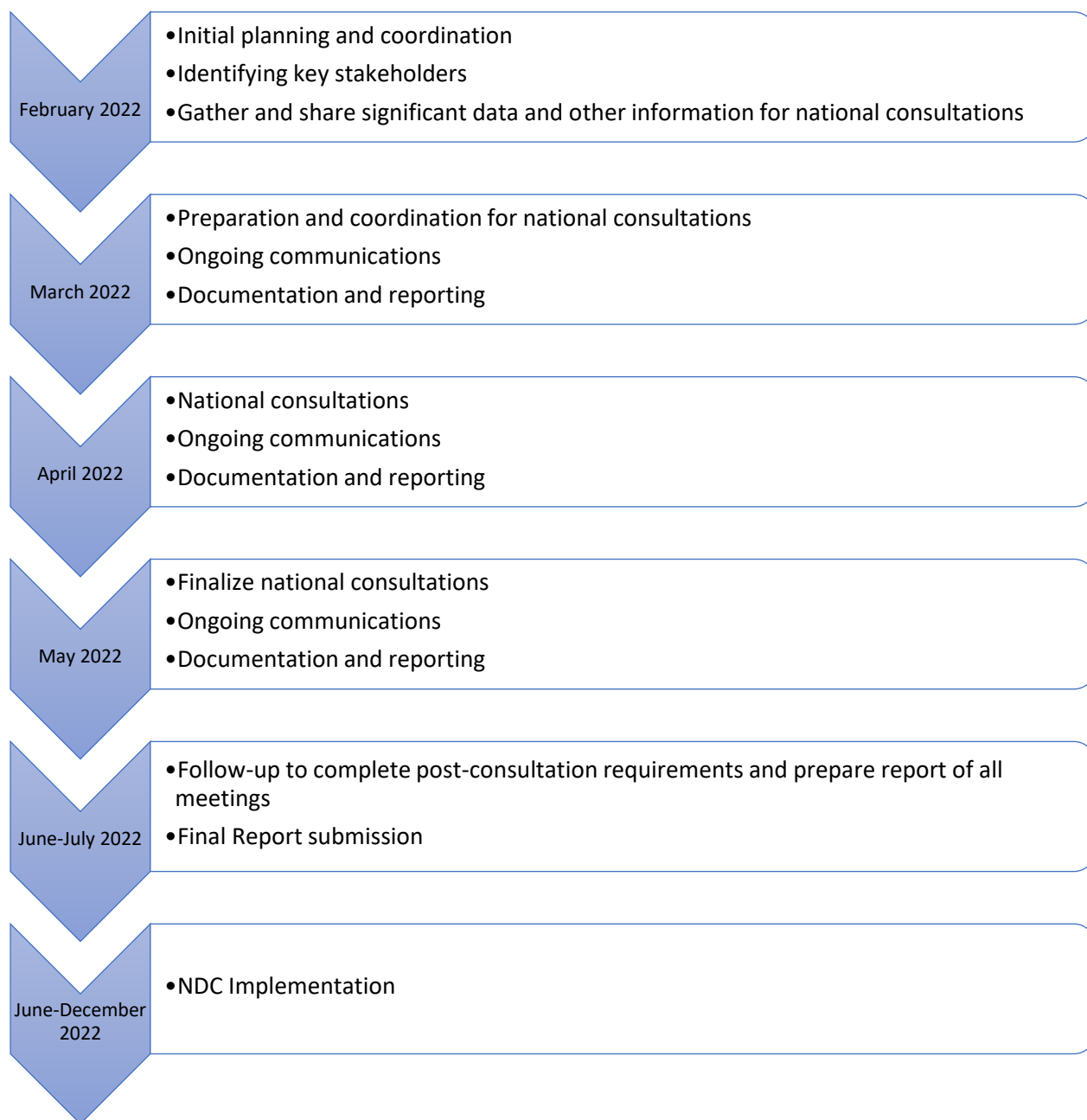
